### HVAC

The useful life of HVAC units is 15–20 years. Four sanctuary HVAC units are 30+ years old and 13 CLC units are 20+ years old. They require immediate replacement.



### A SPACE FOR CHILDREN

Our children's ministry is flourishing and needs a larger gathering space. We will create a dedicated, reimagined space in the CLC designed for our youngest members to grow in faith and find a place of belonging.



### ACCESSIBILITY

Our fellowship hall bathrooms are not accessible to disabled members and visitors. These bathrooms need to be renovated so that everyone feels safe and valued.



### ELECTRONIC SIGN

A 2018 Charlotte DOT traffic study revealed that nearly 33,000 vehicles pass our campus daily. A new electronic sign will allow us to extend our presence and outreach.

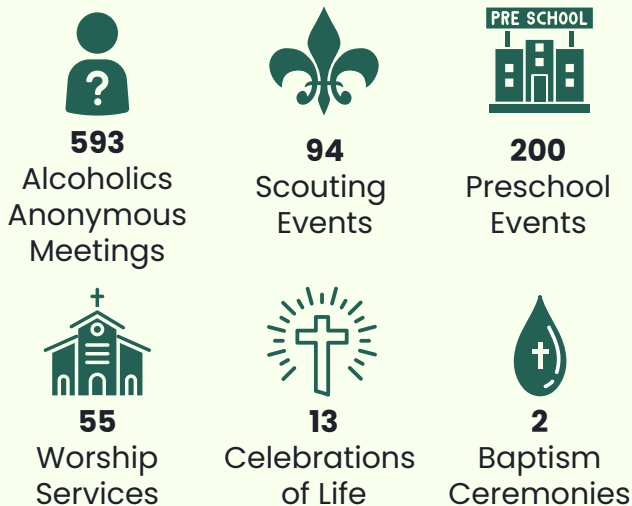

# INVESTING IN IMPACT

Our capital campaign will address critical needs and create new opportunities for ministry. Here are the key priorities:

## Priority Campus Improvements:

- Replace 17 HVAC units across the campus.....\$500,000
- Replace all building roofs within five years.....\$100,000
- Remodel fellowship hall bathrooms .....\$50,000
- Upgrade technology around the campus.....\$50,000
- Enhance building security and safety systems.....\$50,000
- Repair building exteriors....\$80,000

## Facility Enhancements:

- Dedicated Children's Ministry space in the CLC.....\$30,000
- Electronic sign facing Providence Road.....\$20,000
